Visit of the Relic of St John Bosco



The Salesians of Don Bosco are a religious order founded in 1869 by Italian priest St John Bosco to assist poor and

migrant children mainly through the apostolate of education. He was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1934. To mark the centenary of the Salesian Order's presence in the Australia-Pacific region, a relic of the saint is touring the country. The relic will be present in the choir area of the Cathedral of St Stephen **all day on Friday, 13th October**. Masses during the day will be celebrated in honour of St John Bosco. If you visit the relic, you will see a glass case which contains a life-size model of the saint; inside the model there is a medallion which contains a bone segment of John Bosco.

All are welcome to visit the Cathedral during the day and pray before the relic.
