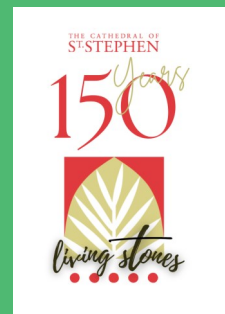

Dear friends,



Today we invite you to contribute to the missionary movement, as Pope Francis has called us to, by accepting the invitation to partner with the Salesian Sisters and Church in Timor-Leste as they provide life-changing health care and foster autonomy for families in need in rural communities. In the eastern region of Timor-Leste lies the rural mountainous town of Venilale. A community riddled with cases of tuberculosis, malnutrition and maternal mortality, the future health and well-being of the community was in question.

Compelled by this reality, the Salesian Sisters set into action and started the Maria Auxiliadora Clinic, with the goal to treat and provide the community with knowledge on their health and well-being.

Sister Carolina, currently a nurse at the clinic and a native to Timor-Leste, was driven to provide better outcomes for her people.

As the Sisters built deep trust and presence within the community, many began to access the resources made available to them. One of these women was Petrolina, who – after hearing of the Sisters clinic – knew she needed to

bring her daughter Vitoria there after noticing her health declining.

Although the clinic is currently running, supply of life-saving medication, consistent staffing and nutrient-rich food for malnourished babies and children are all still needs that Sr Carolina and the clinic require to keep providing care to those in need. Your support today can help ensure that this project can continue supporting families like Vitoria's.

We invite you to partner with the Sisters and Church in Timor-Leste through Catholic Mission today to be part of this critical work in Venilale, and many other life-giving mission programs around the world.



This year's Advent resource invites us to explore more deeply what it means to allow God to come to birth in us. Evangelisation Brisbane has developed "**With Expectant Hearts**" to help us enter a new liturgical year, the journey of faith that stretches before us. The spiritual nourishment God seeks to give us now will come to birth in us through the entire year if we can open our hearts in response to it.

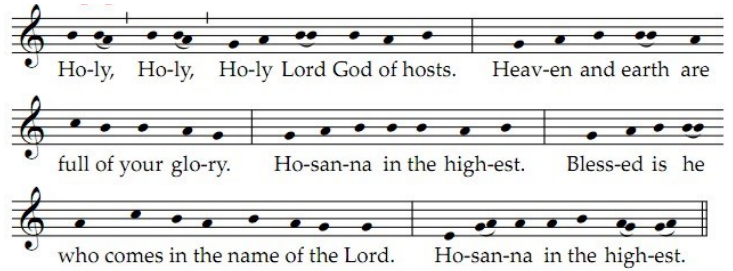

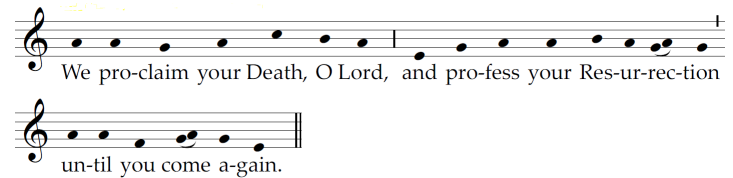

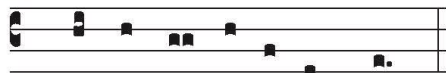
