Readings for today:

Dear friends,

“The following story contains disturbing and graphic scenes that might upset and offend some viewers”. Too many of our current news stories on TV, radio and the internet are preceded by this trigger warning. I say “too many” not because they shouldn’t carry a graphic content warning but because they need to. Daily visions of violence and descriptions of brutality, cruelty and barbarity are dominating our screens. Still, I find it curious that these stories “might” offend only “some” viewers. Shouldn’t we all be offended? Shouldn’t we all cry out against such disregard for the sacred dignity of other human beings, regardless of where they are from? Shouldn’t we pray with all our might and ask the Redeemer of the Human Family, the Prince of Peace, to come to our aid?

And I say “our” aid and not “theirs”, for these are the collective miseries of the human community. This is not about choosing sides. This is about the delusion that peace and freedom by any means is peace and freedom justified. No: Peace and freedom by any means is the chance of peace and freedom destroyed.

During the week, the Commissioner-General of the UN relief agency UNRWA, Philippe Lazzarini, said that he feared that “the world is now losing its humanity”. If history teaches us anything, it teaches us what a world without humanity looks like.

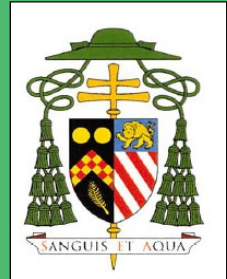
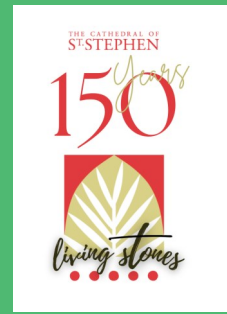
As always, the Word of God has impeccable timing. God speaks these words to Moses and to us today:

You shall not wrong or oppress a resident alien, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt. You shall not abuse any widow or orphan... if your neighbour cries out to me, I will listen, for I am compassionate.

Jesus is equally direct:

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.... You shall love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

This is what finding our humanity looks like. To lose our humanity is to fall into the abyss of unending cycles of violence and hate. To discover the gift of humanity bestowed upon us and our neighbour by God is the true source of every peace. *Fr. Anthony*

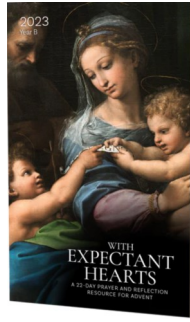


Book of Remembrance

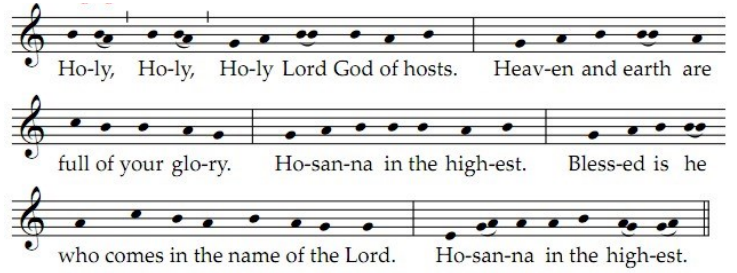

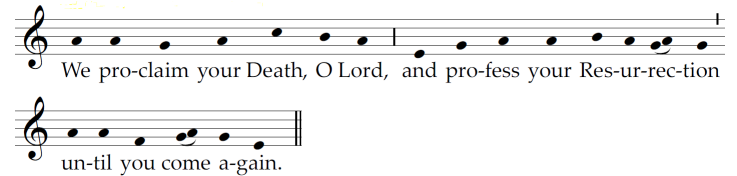
