# **OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE** YEAR A – 26<sup>th</sup> November 2023

### Dear friends,

I wonder if Jesus himself would be happy with a feast called "Christ the King". "Kingship" wasn't one of his favourite images—the kings in Jesus' parables are often absent, angry or tyrannical. They can be generous but also petty if their generosity is rejected. The images of kingship in the New Testament are complex, as they are similarly complex in the Old Testament. King David, although mighty, sends Bathsheba's husband off to battle in order to die so that he could marry her. King Solomon too, the son of King David, has his moments. This man of peace was known for his wisdom, but he could also be vindictive against foes and allies alike. It is said that he was kept busy with 700 wives and 300 concubines. It is no wonder that Jesus prefers the imagery of "shepherd" rather than "king". Ezekiel provides Jesus with the template for his mission and ministry: "I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over

the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them." Jesus is more intent on re-making and remoulding our understanding of leadership so that we too might be both followers of him and leaders within our Christian community and society. Leaving aside the status and privilege of "leadership", Jesus is more interested in re-shaping and resizing our hearts by the power of compassion. A clear example of this interplay between "kingship" and "shepherding" can be heard in today's gospel. We are told: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory..., he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats." Even on the throne of glory Christ remains a shepherd. Of course his real throne is the cross; the place from which he looks for the lost, bandages the wounded and makes the weak strong. In this way, Christ truly reigns as "King". *Fr. Anthony*






