Dear Friends

The Church has been in a joyful and festive mood since the celebration of the birth of Our Lord Iesus Christ on Christmas Day. With the feast of the Baptism of the Lord which brings an end to the Christmas season, the Church ushers in the period of Ordinary Time.

With his manifestation by the voice of the Father and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Jesus' baptism, Jesus himself began his public ministry the call to repentance, bringing us back to God with the invitation 'Come and See'.

Jesus needs people who will help him in his ministry; that is why, this Sunday, we hear the name Andrew and his brother Simon Peter being the first to become disciples.

Having been with Jesus and spent the day listening to him, the first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon. Andrew's life was changed with the encounter he had with Jesus. This was such a clear invitation by God to follow Jesus that Andrew was moved in turn to tell his brother that he had found the Messiah. Andrew was ready to follow God's call.

Had it not been for Andrew, we wonder if Simon would have come to know Jesus who, in turn, called him to a life-changing vocation.

Called by God, we not only recognise him but we also hear his call in our hearts and become instruments of this call for others. Where we encounter God, for instance in our families, our jobs, in the streets, etc - these places become our ministry. When we meet each other today and in the future, we share our moments when we hear God's call. We trust in our everfaithful God who continues to call us. Our call by God helps us to listen and be attentive to the promptings of our hearts. immediate response to God's call shows obedience and willingness.

In these early days of the new year, let there be opportunities to hear these calls from God. May we respond with presence commitment, opening ourselves to faithful futures yet unknown.

Speak, God, for we, your servants, are listening.

Parish Contributions

Our regular parishioners have probably noticed some increases to the Tap'n'Go terminals in the Cathedral. The votive candles are now \$3, while the free-standing donation terminals at the doors are now set to \$15.

We understand the financial pressures on everyone at the moment and the cathedral parish is no different. Our annual insurance premiums have increased significantly and this places extra financial stresses on our budget.

The donation points are voluntary but if you give regularly at these terminals, please be aware of the increase. The suggested cost of votive candles has not increased for a number of years, however our costs for freight have also jumped in recent times. We depend on people's honesty for candles offerings and we do not "police" any payment. If you wish to light a candle and offer a prayer, simply pay whatever you can afford (or nothing if need be). The recommended offering is now \$3.

As part of your regular giving, and if you prefer to give electronically, our collectors are available at the doors with the EFTPOS terminals after each Sunday Mass and these can be set to any amount that you choose.

Later in the year, we will provide the community with a financial report for 2023. For the moment, we thank you for your on-going support in so many ways, not least through your financial generosity. We are reliant on the generous support of our community so that we can minister sacramentally, pastorally and administratively to all who come into the Cathedral precinct. Your on-going support makes this possible. Thank you.


