# Dear Friends

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it!

These are the words of St. Paul in our second reading. Today, is Word of God Sunday. In September 2019, Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter "Aperuit illis," established that the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (in Australia) is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God. This is what we are celebrating this Sunday. Pope Francis, in this year's message of the Word of God Sunday said, "We cannot do without God's word and its quiet and unassuming power that, as if in a personal dialogue, touches the heart, impresses itself on the soul and renews it with the peace of Jesus, which makes us, in turn, concerned for others". St Paul understands the importance of this.

In the Great Commission, our Lord Jesus said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations.... teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you". This also is our call in following his footsteps. Jesus' declaration of the good news of God's life-giving and loving presence and

his call in the light of that is what is most fundamental to us. If we lose touch with this basic proclamation and call of Jesus, all the other elements of our faith will not make anv sense.

If we took Jesus' proclamation and call fully to heart, it would change us. We are asked to believe that at the heart of life is good news not bad news. If we believe that life is essentially bad news, then this conviction will shape how we relate to others, how we behave. The likelihood is that we will not be pleasant people to be around. If, however, we believe that at the heart of life is the life-giving and loving presence of a personal God who calls out to us through his Son, then how we live, how we relate, how we behave will be very different indeed. The Word of God is alive and active.

The fundamental decision that the word of God placed before us today is simple; we can either put our trust in ourselves and use all at our disposal to achieve an earthly glory or can build on God and on His words and receive the eternal life that He is and that He gives.
