Dear friends,

This Sunday afternoon we celebrate the Rite of Election in the Cathedral. In Australia, political elections are compulsory but not this "election". This "election" is very much voluntary and it is certainly not "us" who are doing the voting. It is God who is choosing.

The Rite of Election involves all those across the Archdiocese who are freely responding to God's invitation to enter into a time of final preparation for Initiation into the Paschal Mystery this Easter. That is, they are choosing to come forward to be baptised, confirmed and to be welcomed to the Eucharistic table in their parish communities during the Easter ceremonies.

They are signs to us of the constant renewal of the Church and that, despite or because of everything, there are still people who wish to make a choice to be welcomed into the life of the Church community. They each have an individual story to tell but each is being welcomed into the larger story of the Gospel. Their story is Good News because they wish to become witnesses to the Good News. You too might like to join in the celebration at 3pm on Sunday.

As part of our 150th celebrations, we are inviting all those who will be initiated into Christ this Easter, as well as all those who have celebrated baptisms or confirmations or First Communions at any stage at the Cathedral to return for a special celebration on Sunday April 21 at the 10:00am Mass. Christian Initiation is the threshold sacramental event which is the foundation of our sacramental and Christian life. It doesn't matter if this occurred in the midst of an Easter Vigil or across years of our childhood, in the end, we are all welcomed and born into the life of the same Christ.

The Rite of Election is a reminder that we did not choose Christ but rather Christ has chosen us. Every Eucharist in every season is a celebration of this. *Fr. Anthony*


