Dear friends,

While this Sunday retains its Lenten character, today is also the traditional Solemnity of St. Patrick (although the liturgical feast has been moved to Monday this year). Those of us from an Anglo-Celtic background have been steeped in the stories and traditions of St. Patrick, usually based in sentimental and exaggerated memories of a place (Ireland) that previous generations were trying to forget and subsequent generations had never visited.

As a boy, I remember coming into City Hall to sing at the St. Patrick's Day concert and later as a young man finding my way to Irish pubs that were dotted around the city. All this had something to do with cultural heritage and appropriation, and vague connections to traditions in a non-traditional land and not much to do with spirituality or faith. It is the classic arc of migrant populations seeking some identity and nostalgia for a homeland that is never quite the way that remember or imagine.

The same rhythm is also happening with more recently arrived migrant communities. The broader celebration of the Lunar New Year is a more contemporary example.

The St. Patrick of history is not quite

the St. Patrick of hagiography. The stories that we tell are grander than the real story of St. Patrick but, as is the case often enough, the real story is more interesting. The writings he left behind present a man whose mission was much more extreme and vulnerable and unstable than the mythology depicts.

The basic details of the Patrick story which most people are familiar with are true. He was captured as a youth in Roman Britain, transported to Ireland, where he spent six years as a slave. He eventually escaped and made his way back home. He became a priest and many years later left Britain and returned to Ireland as a missionary. However, being a missionary in a pagan land was no easy task but Irish Catholicism, just like Patrick, has always had a missionary heart. It is this missionary heart that we celebrate, not just on this feast day, but any feast of a saint whose life work bears fruit in the life of a people or nation.

Being a fruitful seed is on Jesus' mind today, so it is appropriate also to consider the energy and efforts of St. Patrick. The real St. Patrick may not have been so glorious, but we can still hail his missionary zeal. *Fr. Anthony*






