
It has been said that Easter is not for the faint-hearted. We are all faint of heart in one way or another but that doesn't mean that Easter is not for us. After all, it is the faint heart which is most in need the power of hope. However, the power of Easter fades if our faint hearts make us retreat along the way; or if our faint hearts jump too easily to a happy ending; or if our faint hearts don't undergo the hard yards of the whole story.

You see, for the last few days, our faint hearts have been beating to the drum of the deepest marks and rhythms of human life. On Thursday night, we stooped down with our arching knees, cusp the crusty feet of others, poured water upon them and dried them as carefully and respectfully as we could. This is our annual reminder that our companions on the journey are real people, whose earthy skin contains the most powerful of sacred stories, and we are at their service. By Thursday night, the veil of darkness has fallen and we braced ourselves for the next day, the day we call "Good". The full deafening stillness was yet to come, but on this "Good" day, we walked with the suffering One, not to partake in a gruesome spectacle like voyeurs finding satisfaction in defeat, but because we know that this is our unavoidable path too, the only way to pass through life's deepest sorrows to the promise of the beyond. On this day, person after person after person came forward and touched the cross: every single reality of human life, of sorrow, suffering, sadness and sin was laid bare. This was a procession of the humbled; of the willing-up of the simple yet powerful yearning for redemption. Every touch was the same; each touch was unique, and God knew each and every one.

After the Saturday of the long silence, we saw a glimmer of light and heard a whisper of Alleluia. This Light pushed back the darkness and the cry grew from a whisper to a joyous song of praise. Today, stones have been rolled away. The immovable has been moved. The impossible is now the truest law of nature: Life-death-NEW LIFE.

Even faint hearts know this to be true. Perhaps Easter is for the faint-hearted after all. But Easter has not yet happen for the heart that seeks to hold back the stone, that refuses to sing Alleluia, that extinguishes the candle defending the light against the dark. It is not a question of who Easter is for: it is for everyone and everything. Rather, it is a question of whether we can sense and believe that Easter has happened and continues to happen – for you and me and for all the ages. Stones can be difficult to roll away, some days it is hard to raise our voice in praise and lights can grow dim. That is, if these things are left to the work of our faint hearts alone.

Easter is not a fairy-tail ending. It is about the life of real people, experiencing real things and facing real death. And, in the end, it is about the real divine life who rises to claim even the faintest of hearts. Alleluia! Fr. Anthony




