Readings for today: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; 1 John 2:1-5; Luke 24:35-48



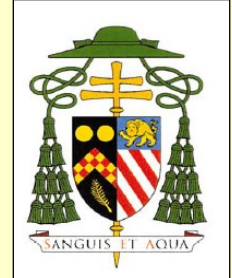
Dear friends,

I can't remember who asked this question, but he or she was making an important point: "Have you ever noticed how many of the resurrection appearances of Jesus involve food?" This person went on to detail the seven different accounts of the resurrection appearances, and that four of them involve a meal:

- Mark describes how Jesus appeared to the disciples while they were at table.
- Luke tells the story of being with the two disciples on their way to Emmaus, and when they got there, they sat down to supper, and that's when they recognised Jesus.
- Today's gospel from Luke continues on from this: Jesus asks if they have anything to eat, and he eats some baked fish.
- John's Gospel describes an appearance on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. Seven of the disciples come in from fishing and there is Jesus cooking some bread and fish on a charcoal fire. And he says to them, "Come, have breakfast."

So what does all this tell us? It tells us that the Risen Jesus didn't come simply to be seen or touched or to be a baffling, bewildering, obscure presence. He didn't come simply to give a speech or to give a direct account of what life is like on the other side. He comes to be present to us and present with us, in a way that only shared meals can offer. If you think of the times when you have felt most enlivened and most deeply connected to others whether they be family, friends, even strangers, my hunch would be that many of these moments would have something to do with sharing a meal, a celebration, a gathering of some sort – large or small, grand or simple. In these spaces and places, we discover "the more" of life; we discover that there is always something more going on than meets the eye. And Jesus' resurrection is about the discovery that there is more to life - and death - then we can ever imagine. The joy of a shared meal and shared company is both a gift and sign of the resurrection.

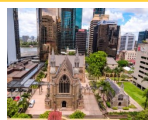

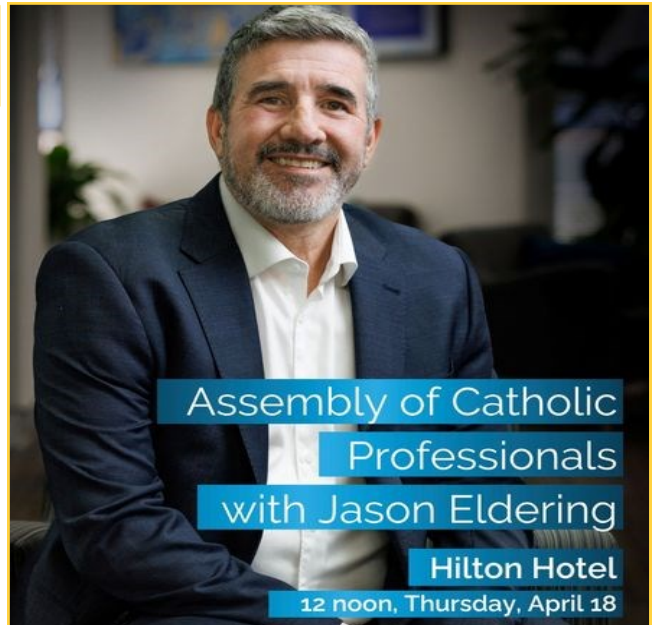

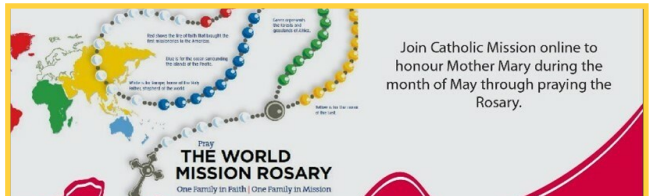
