### Dear friends,

We are at the mid-point of the Easter season. Even so, Easter is never far away from Good Friday (just as Good Friday is never from Easter), as we have been reminded during this past week.

On Saturday, Bondi Junction in Sydney was the focus of the latest act of random and inexplicable violence. Our society is, once again, forced to confront our collective approach to homelessness, mental health and violence against women. The truth of the matter is that people with mental illness are more likely to be victims of violence rather than perpetrators. We cannot pretend that there are easy or quick solutions to any of these issues but we know these realities affect families, communities, and society as a whole. They remind us that this is a constant, long and difficult conversation in search of some collective remedies. We must not despair because every Good Friday has an Easter; every Easter is the result of Good Fridays. This is the hope that the Christian community can offer.

The Christian community itself became the focus of further violence on Monday. Mar Mari Emmanuel, an Assyrian Orthodox Christian bishop of Christ the Good Shepherd Church in Sydney, was stabbed along with his assistant priest, Fr Isaac Royel, after which a riot ensued, injuring police attempting to protect the community. It goes without saying that Christian communities need to be witnesses to peacemaking in a world prone to violence.

And on Thursday at the Cathedral we farewelled one of our own: Fr Marty Larsen. Marty was only 48 years old and died unexpectedly. Sudden death always exposes many things, but what has been the common refrain in this past week is the good nature, humour and enthusiasm with which Marty lived and ministered. He was a good man whose legacy has touched the hearts and spirits of so many. Today we turn to the Good Shepherd, the Risen One, Jesus Christ, who knows Good Friday, and more importantly, reveals Easter Sunday. Fr. Anthony







Give glory to our God, The Father, and the Son, And also to the Paraclete, Eternal Three-in-One.


