Dear friends,

God cares for us. Last weekend's miracle of the multiplication of loaves proved that. Even more, in this weekend's first reading, the book of Exodus also recalls God's giving of manna from heaven to feed the Israelite people all the way to the Promised Land. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the Jews that the manna that God gave to their ancestors in the desert was not real bread but only a symbol of the bread that God would give to humankind. The true bread is the Bread of Life. Jesus affirmed that this bread is Himself, when he said to them: "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35).

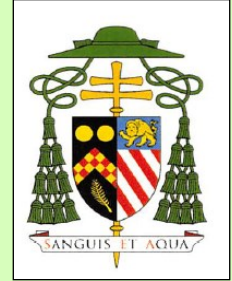
Human beings have many desires that need to be satisfied, the first of which is to satisfy our physical hunger. In addition, there are other spiritual desires such as the need to be understood, protected, cared for,

sympathized with... But the most basic and deepest need is to be loved. Saint John said: "God is Love" (1 John 4:16). Indeed, God is the source of love, all love must come from God, only God can satisfy that need for us. Whoever is loved lives in happiness; and true and lasting happiness is found only in God.

Whoever wants to have eternal life and enjoy true happiness, is invited to come and eat the food of eternal life which is Jesus Himself, as He said: "I am the bread of life" (John 6:35). And where can we find that food? It is in the Word of God. It is in the Eucharist. It is the Divine food that nourishes us on our journey to heaven.

Friends, we are all invited to come and share the Divine food so that our soul will be fed by God's Word and the Body and Blood of the Lord.
