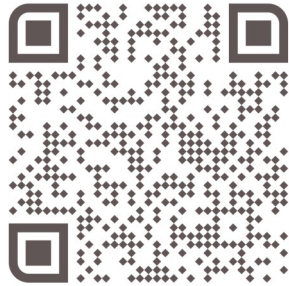

We praise your name in word and deed.

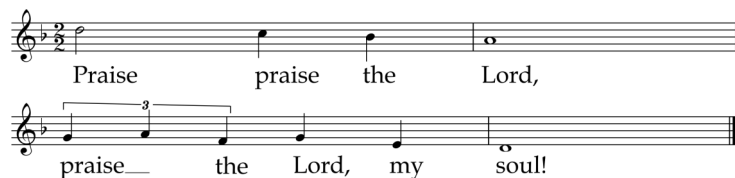
