

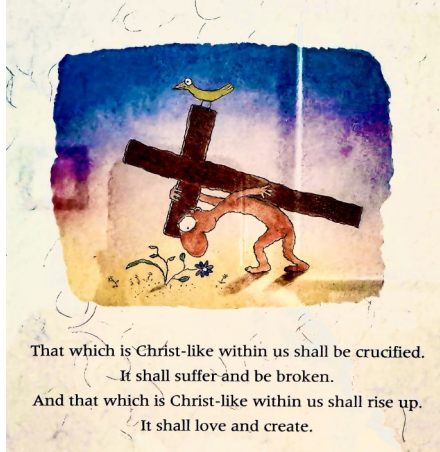

Dear friends,

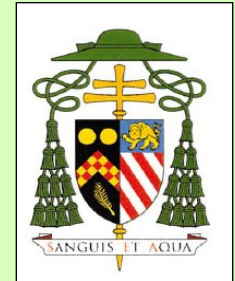
Above is one of my favourite Michael Leunig images with its accompanying prayer: *That which is Christ-like within us shall be crucified. It shall suffer and be broken. And that which is Christ-like within us shall rise up. It shall love and create.*

The reality that we call the “Paschal Mystery” is all about what can be created (and re-created) by the fragments left by sorrow, grief, pain, anguish, violence, death – everything that attempts to bring darkness and finality to all that is born of the endless instinct for light and life. All that is of Christ will suffer and be broken; all that is of Christ will love and create.

Peter stumbles during the little “Q&A” session that Jesus has with his disciples because he can’t grapple with a new reality that brokenness and loss could actually lead to anything—and most certainly nothing new.

For Peter, hemmed in by a human perspective, defeat is defeat, failure is failure, and death is absolutely death. How could it possibly be anything else?

God will go on creating and loving regardless of whether we join in or not. Jesus didn’t ask Peter’s permission to rise from the dead, nor check-in with him to see if he understood before that first Easter morn. The real point is: can we be free enough to participate in what God is doing in our lives? If all we want to do and are capable of doing is to bury our shame and sorrow, then there is very little chance that we can be touched by the power of the Paschal Mystery. The weight of our cross will push our face into the dirt. If, on the other hand, we can notice the little seed of something new growing among the rubble and the ruin, there is a chance that Paschal Mystery might become our Paschal reality. *Fr. Anthony*

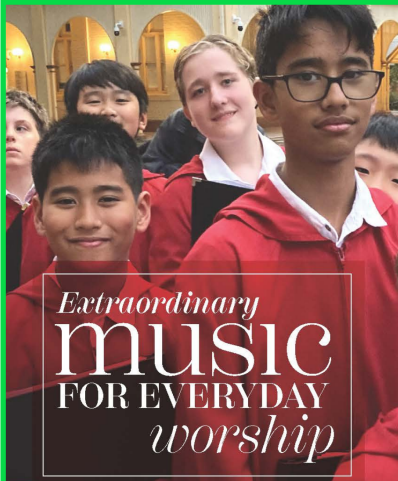
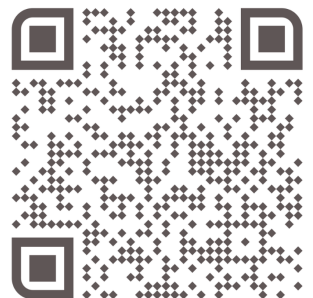
# Sacred Music Appeal

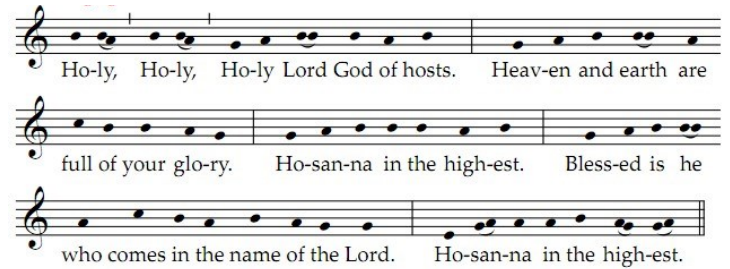

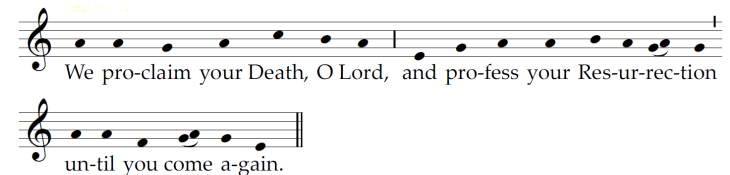
