

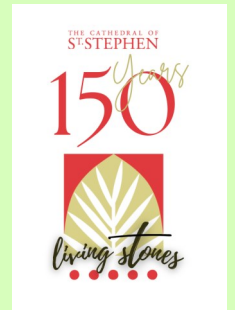
# TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Friends,

In our reflection on the readings that are proclaimed at Mass, we often overlook the richness that is contained in the Responsorial Psalm. Today's psalm is Psalm 18 (or 19 in some translations) and its response is: *The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart.*

A precept, in essence, is a rule that seeks to address or regulate a person's behaviour or thoughts. The 'precepts of the Lord' in the psalm refer to the Law of Moses - following God's law defined the Jewish people. This was not to be a case of mindless adherence. Faithfulness to God's law is what 'gives joy to the heart', something that is meaningful but, more importantly, life-giving.

Pope Francis refers often to the 'joy' of the Gospel. This joy reflects our faithfulness to the new Law, the new covenant in the new life of the Person who died and rose for me, who speaks to me, who addresses me by my name, and who walks alongside me.

The Liturgy of the Word is an all-embracing moment in the Mass. We are fed by it, just as we are fed from the table of the Eucharist. The rich 'food' of the Word helps us to grow in our faith. It prepares us for Eucharist where we recognise Jesus 'in the breaking of the bread' and in whose Body we dwell.

Listen carefully to today's psalm and let us make its words a reflection of the our own story:

*The law of the Lord is perfect,  
it revives the soul;  
the rule of the Lord is to be trusted,  
it gives wisdom to the simple;  
the fear of the Lord is holy,  
abiding for ever;  
the decrees of the Lord are truth  
and all of them just.*

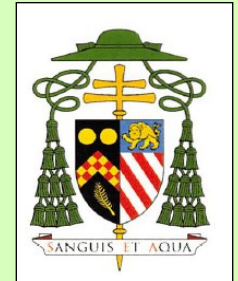
If you have a bible at home, take a few minutes later today to read the whole psalm, not just the parts that are used in today's liturgy. These words speak to you and me about a God who loves us into new life – to become what Jesus later speaks of in the Beatitudes: the pure in heart, the peacemaker, those who are humble, poor in spirit, merciful, hungry for righteousness.

And how beautiful are the last two stanzas of the psalm that speak of the repentant and humble soul - yes, you and me – saved and forgiven by a loving God.

So, let's be joyful. Let's leave this place today with joy in our hearts; and together with the psalmist we can pray:

*Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer (v14).*

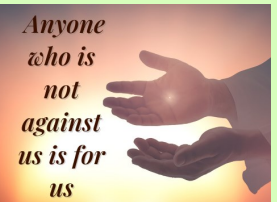

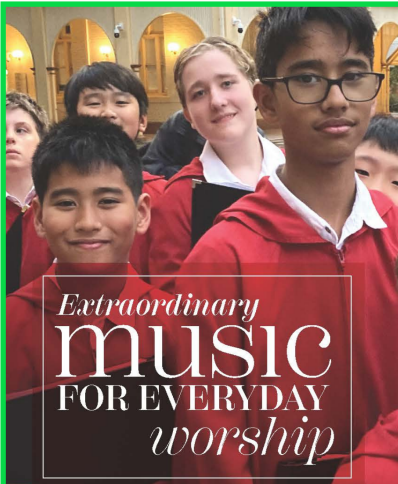

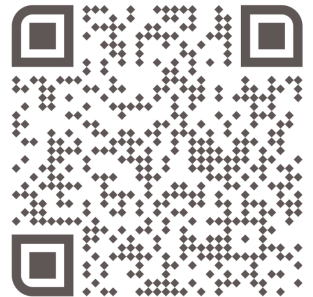
## Sacred Music Appeal

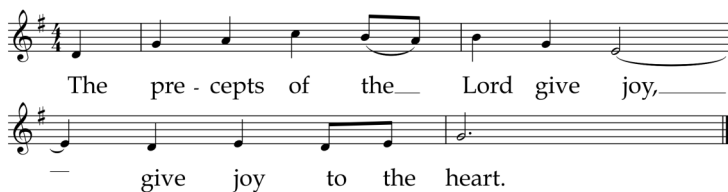

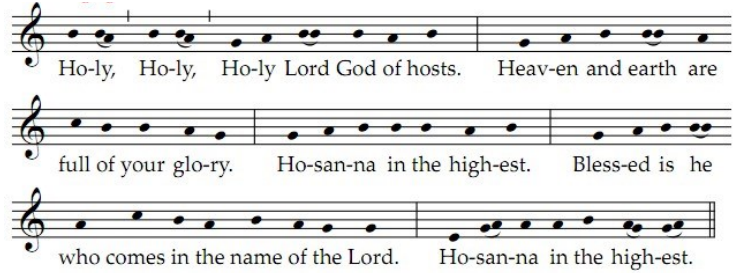

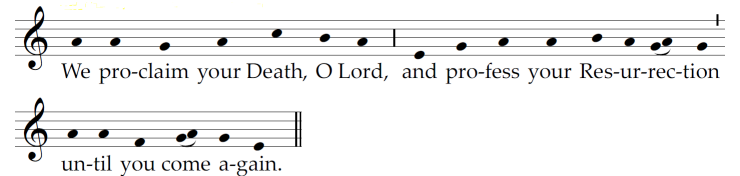
