Dear Friends

A man came to Jesus and asked: Good Master, what must I do? This man is representative of the majority of people who are searching for happiness and meaning in life. Indeed, life is a continuous journey in search of happiness. The thing is the concept of happiness is different for each person. The man in the Gospel is described as a devout man. From his childhood, he had strictly observed the commandments of the Law of Moses: do not commit adultery, do not murder, do not steal, do not bear false witness, do not defraud; honour your father and mother. He was confident enough to affirm to Jesus his moral practices. However, Jesus wanted him to go further on the path of perfection. By asking the man to sell all his possessions, Jesus was asking him to give up everything he was attached to, even give up himself, to follow Him.

What must I do? That is also the question we must ask ourselves regularly, to evaluate what we are doing and where we are going. This question also helps us look back at ourselves, to realize the mission that God wants us to carry out in life. Because, living in this world, each

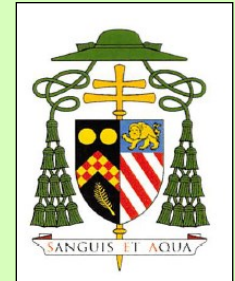
person has a mission to complete. However, to realize the true mission of life is not that easy sometimes.

What must I do to inherit eternal life? The answer is wisdom. The first reading shows us the necessity of wisdom. According to the teachings of the Church, wisdom is one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. This gift helps us see clearly the nature of things or of a person, not observing them emotionally or by their superficial appearance. Because superficial things often deceive the senses.

Also, according to the Church's teaching, true wisdom is God. That wisdom is personified in the incarnate Word, Jesus Christ. He is the wisdom of God. He is the Saviour of the world. Jesus declared: "I am the way, the truth and the life." (John 14:6) Through this declaration, He affirmed that those who believe in Him will be led by Him to the Father, the source of all blessings.

Friends, believing in Jesus Christ is the secret to gaining wisdom and also to achieving happiness in this life and the next.

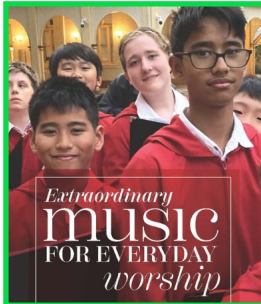

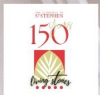

Weigh my petition, Lord, with care.

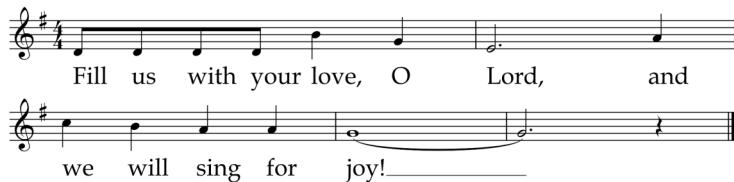
