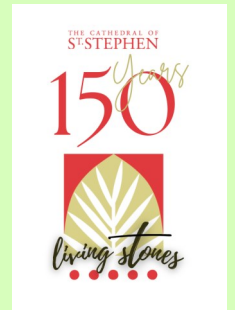


33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B – 17 NOVEMBER 2024

Dear Friends,

If you have ever wandered around the Powerhouse at New Farm, you may have stumbled across what appears at first glance to be one of those standard Brisbane City Council signs telling us what we're allowed to do or what will incur a fine.

This rather enigmatic one which stands along the pathway near the river is totally meaningless in its wording. It was obviously planted there for the sole purpose of eliciting a smile from a passer-by – and, I suppose, in that respect it fulfilled its purpose—well, certainly with me anyway as I stood there not a little perplexed!

However, in another respect, it made me reflect on all those things I might see in my daily life but to which I pay little heed and maybe do nothing about: the people I sit next to on the bus, the person who sleeps rough around the Cathedral at night, the shop assistant at the checkout, even the person I spend all Mass time sitting next to but only acknowledge at the Sign of Peace!

Today – 17th November – has been declared *World Day of the Poor* by Pope Francis. In his message for this day (you can read it in full here: <https://rb.gy/9ki376>), he writes: ‘(Today) is a pastoral opportunity not to be underestimated, for it challenges every believer to listen to the prayer of the poor,

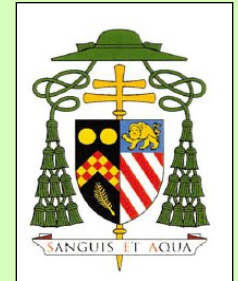
becoming aware of their presence and needs.’

Our gospel calling is that we not ignore the signs around us as irrelevant nor walk by on the other side of the road. ‘Each individual Christian and every community,’ writes Francis in his encyclical *Evangelii Gaudium*, ‘is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully a part of society’ (#187). In fact, the theme for this day, chosen by Pope Francis is: *The prayer of the poor rises up to God.*

So, at the heart of our attentiveness to the poor must be prayer. The beautiful words of St Teresa of Calcutta, which Francis quotes in his message to us, speak of the essential nature of prayer that opens our eyes and our hearts: “I am only a poor sister who prays. By praying, Jesus puts his love in my heart, and I go to give it to all the poor I meet along the way. Pray too! Pray, and you will notice the poor who are beside you...pray, and your eyes will open, and your heart will fill with love”.

So, friends, let us take time to notice and not be like another tongue-in-cheek sign standing a short distance away from the first. Let us listen to the voice of God, understand and heed the cry of the poor and pray that our eyes *will* be open and our hearts be filled with love.

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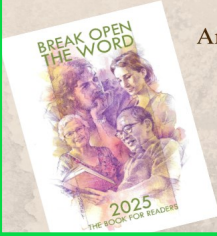

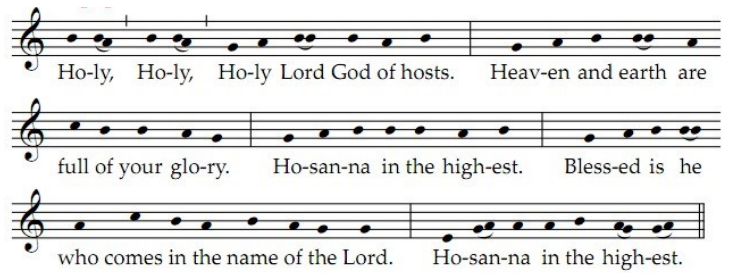

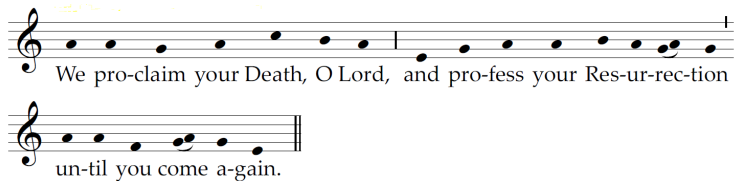
