

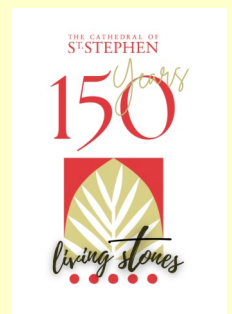
OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

They say that every profession and cause has its own special saint. And on Friday (November 22), we celebrated the Feast of Saint Cecilia, patron saint of musicians. Very little detail is known of Cecilia's short life, but we remember her as a martyr for the faith in the earliest days of the Church. Born in Rome in the third century (when the Church was heavily persecuted), she is said to have 'heard the angels in heaven' here on Earth, and is often depicted playing a harp or portative organ. Her incorruptible body was found in the catacombs in Rome centuries after her death. The story of St Cecilia's brief life and courageous faith have been shared through the generations.

The Sacred Arts enrich our lives of faith in so many ways. We adorn our worship, our churches, and our lives with the skilled artwork to make beautiful the presence and joy of God among us. Pause for a moment and look around you... when did you last notice and appreciate the God-given talent and inspiration found in makers of the stained glass, the music, the sculptures, the architecture and so much more in our Cathedral and churches? It is there at every turn. Let us especially pray for all musicians, singers, composers and instrument makers whose use their artistry and skill for the greater Glory of God.

Next week, we commence the new Church year with the season of Advent. From the Latin *adventus* (tr. His coming) the short weeks in the leadup to the birth of Christ at Christmas asks us to prepare our hearts and minds for the greatest gift from God: His Son, Jesus Christ, the Word-made-flesh who dwelt among us. Despite what the world around us might be spruiking (and

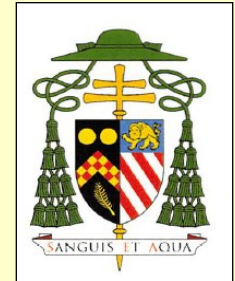
incorrectly claiming as 'the Christmas Season'), it's not about presents, trees, the frivolities nor the commercialism... Jesus alone IS the reason!

What will you do this Advent to prepare differently? Perhaps you will come to the Cathedral on the Sunday afternoons in December and spend an hour with Our Lord in anticipation and gratitude for what we will receive at Christmas. Acclaimed English poet and theologian Isaac Watts (1674-1748) so beautifully penned: *'Let every heart prepare a home where such a Mighty Guest may come'*. And what a better way than to celebrate this than with sacred music, the earthly songs of the angels.

Four special events will take place this Advent; mark your diaries and be inspired:

- Two beautiful Sacred Music concerts focused on the season of Advent on Sundays December 1 and 15;
- Solemn Vespers of the Immaculate Conception on Sunday December 8 (led by the Cathedral Schola). Vespers is the simple yet ancient evening prayer of the Church, where we gather in thanksgiving, as the sun sets, to pray for the world and its needs ;
- the Annual Service of Carols and Readings in the Cathedral on Sunday December 22, where the story of the birth of Christ is told through readings, the singing of everyone's favourite carols, and inspiring choral music led by our combined Choirs.

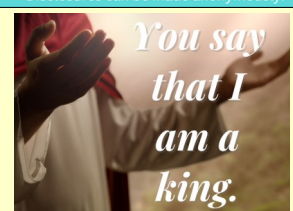




Liturgical Ministry for Christmas Masses
