Dear Friends,

The countdown is well and truly on for the 150th celebrations of the Cathedral. Two of the three concerts for the Queensland Symphony Orchestra are sold out; only tickets for the Saturday evening remain (May 11). Having the QSO perform here is a great coup for us but it also means adjustments to our usual schedule.

Please note: On Thursday May 9, Friday May 10, and Saturday May 11 all liturgical celebrations will be in the Chapel.

The Cathedral will be closed during these days and all of our usual liturgical celebrations will be in the chapel (Masses, Adoration, Benediction, Reconciliation). This is so that we can accommodate the staging for the QSO concerts.

Friday, May 17, Saturday May 18, and Sunday May 19 will all be days of major celebration.

12:30pm Mass on May 17, will be the 150th Anniversary Mass of the Cathedral. This Mass will be much larger than our usual 12:30pm, and we will be joined by the Apostolic Nuncio and bishops from around Australia.

Please note: The 10am Mass, 10:30-11:30am Confessions, Adoration and Benediction will all be in the chapel that day.

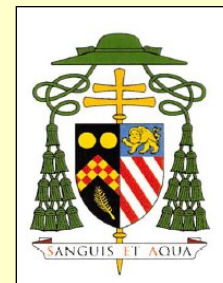
That evening we will celebrate Ecumenical Prayer of Thanksgiving with a combined ecumenical choir. This is sure to be one of the highlights of our celebrations.

The following day (May 18), we will celebrate Archbishop Mark's Golden Jubilee of Priestly Ordination with Mass at 11:30am. Confessions will be in the chapel. That same evening we will celebrate an extended Pentecost Vigil at 6pm and conclude with Benediction at 8:30pm. This will be a slightly longer Mass than usual.

Finally, our celebrations will culminate with Pentecost Sunday Mass at **10:30am (Please note: there is no 10am or 12noon Mass that day).** This celebration will be led by the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Balvo, and followed by a family festival in the precinct grounds.

These will be grand days for our Cathedral and I hope that you can join us for all or part of these celebrations.

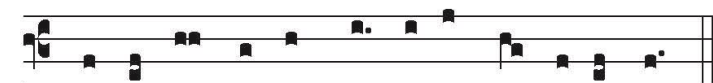

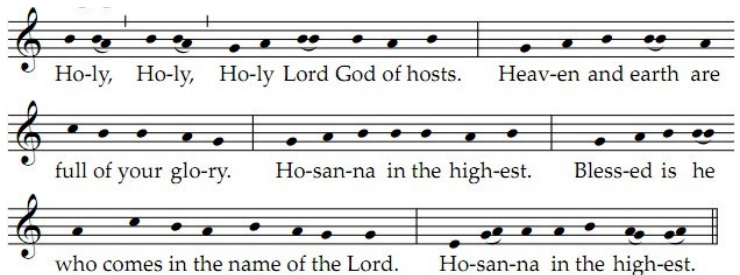

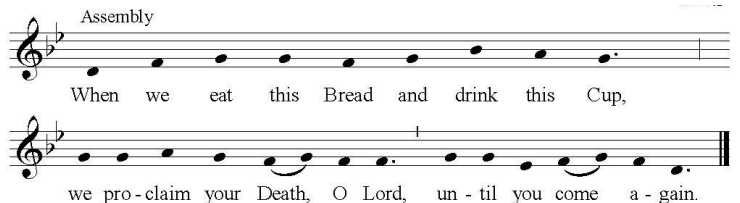

The Midday Mass is today led by the Cathedral Schola. All other Masses are led by a cantor.

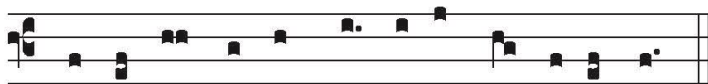
