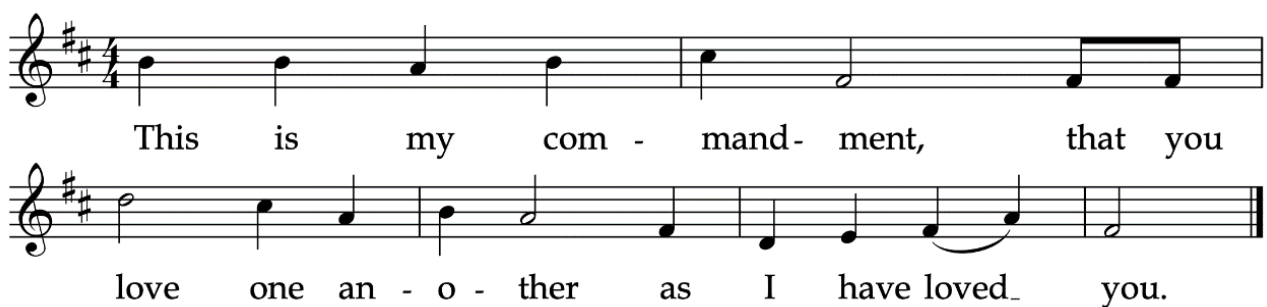



TRANSFER OF THE MOST BLESSED SACRAMENT

*The Blessed Sacrament is left on the altar after Communion.
Following the Prayer after Communion, all KNEEL when the Blessed
Sacrament is censed. The Blessed Sacrament is carried in procession to the
Altar of Repose (in the Chapel of Saint Stephen, adjacent to the Cathedral).
During the Procession, ALL sing:*

**1. Sing, my tongue, the Saviour's glory,
of his flesh the mystery sing;
of the blood, all price exceeding,
shed by our immortal King,
destined, for the world's redemption,
from a noble womb to spring.**

**2. Of a pure and spotless Virgin
born for us on earth below,
he, as man, with man conversing,
stayed, the seeds of truth to sow;
then he closed in solemn order
wondrously his life of woe.**

**3. On the night of that last supper,
seated with his chosen band,
he the paschal victim eating,
first fulfils the Law's command;
then, as food for his apostles,
gives himself with his own hand.**

**4. Word made flesh, the bread of nature
by his word to flesh he turns;
wine into his blood he changes:
what though sense no change discerns?
only be the heart in earnest,
faith her lesson quickly learns.**

On reaching the Altar of Repose, the Archbishop kneels and censes the Sacrament, while the following final verses are sung by the Choir:

Tantum ergo Sacramentum
Veneremur cernui: Et antiquum
documentum Novo cedat ritui:
Praestet fides supplementum
Sensuum defectui.

*Down in adoration falling, this great
Sacrament we hail, over ancient forms
of worship newer rites of grace prevail;
Faith will tell us Christ is present,
When our human senses fail.*

Genitori, Genitoque, Laus et
jubilatio, Salus, honor, virtus
quoque Sit et benedictio:
Procedenti ab utroque
Compar sit laudatio. Amen.

*To the Everlasting Father, and the Son
who made us free; and the Spirit, God
proceeding from them Each eternally:
Be salvation, honour, blessing, might
and endless majesty. Amen.*
