Easter 2025

What began in darkened storm and hostile wind culminates with rising sun and sacred water. The cloud of shrouded heaviness has been superseded by autumn's dappled light - marking a spiritual movement from anxious turbulence to peaceful delight. Cyclone

Alfred stumbled into the preface of this Lent, overtook our preparations and disturbed our purple penitence with its grey haze.

So it is with life's cyclones: never predictable, never convenient, never certain when they are over.

As with cyclones, so too with Lent. The starkness of Lent is rarely a straight-forward journey to the Paschal feast. This is because Lent moves with the rhythm of cyclonic uncertainty - a practice shaped by all manner of external forces which ensures that Lents are seldom of our own making, frequently a scrambled response to life's realities as much as a steady discipline of pieties of our own choosing.

Regardless of the twists and turns, Lent always leads to the power of Easter. Easter arrives as much as a relief than a revelation. Not quite astonished and surprised as we might be, still the story washes over us again and stirs a sense of simple yet profound gratitude and hopefulness. We sense the power of this whispered promise as a gift which plants the deepest seeds of possibility, as a grace which lingers as the sweet fragrance of newness, as a joy which pulsates as creation gives birth once more.

Life may be uncertain but Easter is always certain. This makes it no less a miracle because it is an act of Divine fidelity: for sure, a miracle in Jesus' tomb but no less in all the tombs that darken our hearts, shake our spirits, and threaten our worlds. Whenever the winds of destruction come, we reflexively run toward our tombish bunkers and seal ourselves in with our compulsions and addictions and delusions and obsessions. From all raging portends, we escape into our tombs. But even there, we are not left untouched by the Divine will: we hear the creaking and groaning sound of stones rolling back and shafts of the thinnest light shining through. Now the Easter song calls us forth to break free, to leave our sheltered caves, to come out into the fresh and clear air. Easter is certain - but the choice remains ours. Easter, this free gift, is only "free" and only a "gift" if we recognise our tombs as "tombs" - dead-ends of dark shrill - and accept the summons of Easter's gentle, persistent voice, and decide by some miracle, to stumble, however falteringly, towards the bright promise of the Light of Life.
