Dear friends,

Jesus says that the way of true liberation is renunciation, even of what we seem to depend upon - family, possessions, even our own life. Our true security is found in sharing the sacrifice of the Cross. This is strange: loss turns out to be gain and death turns out to be life. That's the logic of God that underlies his plan.

The Annual Catholic Campaign takes its place within that logic and that plan. Each year the Campaign invites the Catholic community to help in accomplishing God's plan. Supporting the ministries through the Annual Catholic Campaign involves renunciation, even sacrifice. But I ask you to make a calm and reasonable assessment of what you can give and to do so in recognition of where your true security lies, what your life really depends upon. What is also clear is that your generosity will be the answer to someone's prayer, which is again the way God wants it to be.

The Annual Catholic Campaign was intended to reduce multiple Sunday appeals to a single appeal. But the intention behind it goes far beyond that. In the end, the intention is to call the Catholic people of the Archdiocese into the unfolding plan of God - not just to help the needy but to bring to birth a new ordering of human relationships, a society where brothers and sisters can embrace each other in the compassion of God. So I urge you to say yes to that.

## NATIONAL CHILD PROTECTION WEEK 1-7 SEPTEMBER

The focus during this past week was National Child Protection Week. However, the theme chosen this year remains relevant always:

**Kids do well when parents are supported  
To raise thriving kids, parents need support  
to navigate life's choppy waters.**

The National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (NAPCAN) gives pointers for ways we may support this focus. While many points are already in effect in our parishes, three recommendations are attitudes all of us can develop. They are:

Be a positive role model. Children and young people learn from the people that they spend time with, so make your influence positive.

Be open to making connections with any child, young person or community member who needs your support regardless of cultural background or religious beliefs, to further perpetuate an environment of acceptance and tolerance.

Think about safe and respectful ways to be an active bystander if you see an adult being inappropriate towards a child or young person.


# Music at the 10.00am Solemn Mass

 Keeping my eyes fixed on your law.





### TRIAL OF ELECTRONIC COLLECTION PLATES


We live in an increasingly cashless society. With this in mind, from **next weekend** we will be having a trial use of "tap and go" on our collection plates at Mass. You can either place cash in the plate, or "tap" your credit card on the built-in card reader. Each "tap" of your card will be a donation of \$10 (you may of course, tap more than once with several seconds between each tap, to give in multiples of \$10). We trial the new technology for the next couple of months and we will then assess how the new system is working.
