#### **MONDAY 30 September 2024** Saint Jerome

#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:**

Blessed indeed is he  
who ponders the law of the Lord day and  
night: he will yield his fruit in due  
season.

**FIRST READING:** Job 1:6-22

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** *Ps 16:1-3, 6-7*

**R.** Lord, bend your ear and hear my  
prayer.

Lord, hear a cause that is just,  
pay heed to my cry.  
Turn your ear to my prayer:  
no deceit is on my lips. **R.**

From you may my judgement come  
forth.

Your eyes discern the truth.  
You search my heart, you visit me by  
night.  
You test me and you find in me no  
wrong. **R.**

I am here and I call, you will hear me, O  
God.

Turn your ear to me; hear my words.  
Display your great love, you whose right  
hand saves  
your friends from those who rebel  
against them. **R.**

#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:**

The Lord led her and taught her, and  
kept her as the apple of his eye. Like  
an eagle spreading its wings he took  
her up and bore her on his shoulders.  
The Lord alone was her guide.

**FIRST READING:** Job 3:1-3, 11-17, 20-23

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** *Ps 87:2-8*

**R.** Let my prayer come before you,  
Lord.

Lord my God, I call for help by day;  
I cry at night before you.

Let my prayer come into your  
presence.

O turn your ear to my cry. **R.**

For my soul is filled with evils;  
my life is on the brink of the grave.  
I am reckoned as one in the tomb:  
I have reached the end of my  
strength. **R.**

Like one alone among the dead;  
like the slain lying in their graves;  
like those you remember no more,  
cut off, as they are, from your hand. **R.**

You have laid me in the depths of the  
tomb,  
in places that are dark, in the depths.  
Your anger weighs down upon me:  
I am drowned beneath your waves. **R.**

#### **ENTRANCE ANTHIPHON:**

Angels of the Lord, bless the Lord,  
praise and exalt him above all for  
ever.

**FIRST READING:** Exodus 23:20-23

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM:**

*Ps 90:1-6,10-11*

R. He has put his angels in charge of  
you, to guard you in all your ways.

He who dwells in the shelter of the  
Most High  
and abides in the shade of the  
Almighty  
says to the Lord: 'My refuge,  
my stronghold, my God in whom I  
trust!' R.

It is he who will free you from the  
snare  
of the fowler who seeks to destroy  
you;  
He will conceal you with his pinions  
and under his wings you will find  
refuge. R.

You will not fear the terror of the  
night  
nor the arrow that flies by day,  
nor the plague that prowls in the  
darkness  
nor the scourge that lays waste at  
noon. R.

Upon you no evil shall fall,  
no plague approach where you dwell.  
For you has he commanded his  
angels,  
to keep you in all your ways. R.

#### **ENTRANCE ANTHIPHON:**

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:**

*Ps 138:1-3, 7-10, 13-14*

**R.** Guide me, Lord, along the everlasting way.

O Lord, you search me and you know me,  
you know my resting and my rising,  
you discern my purpose from afar.  
You mark when I walk or lie down,  
all my ways lie open to you. **R.**

O where can I go from your spirit,  
or where can I flee from your face?  
If I climb the heavens, you are there.  
If I lie in the grave you are there. **R.**

If I take the wings of the dawn  
and dwell at the sea's furthest end,
