Dear friends,

Red Wednesday, 20th November, is an initiative of Aid to the Church in Need (ACN). It is an opportunity to highlight the persecution of Christians around the world and to pray for them. Red Wednesday is connected to the release of ACN's biannual report *Persecuted and Forgotten? A report on Christians oppressed for their Faith*. As the report states: "Although there has been a decline in violence against Christians in some parts of the world, the past two years have failed to deliver the long-awaited break-through moment when religious hatred gives way to tolerance. Nor is it likely anytime soon. The rise of authoritarian regimes and popular nationalism bodes ill for Christians in countries as diverse as India, Burma (Myanmar) and China, where Christianity is seen as not only alien but as an

agent of unwanted Western influence. In parts of Africa, Islamist violence is putting huge pressure on Christians. In Iraq and Syria, Christians are voting with their feet by continuing to emigrate; each person who leaves makes it harder for those left behind. If Pope Francis goes to Iraq in 2020 what remnant of the Christian community will he find there?"

During this week, the outside of the Cathedral will be lit in red to stand in solidarity with all persecuted Christians and those who have shed their blood as martyrs. On Wednesday, November 20, Archbishop Coleridge will celebrate Mass at 5:10pm to pray for all Christian communities which are facing persecution and threat of extinction. 
SVDP CHRISTMAS HAMPER APPEAL



A few minutes before 10 o'clock, the Cathedral Choir processes from the Sacristy singing the Introit. The assembly **responds** as the Choir and Ministers process towards the altar with the following translation of the Introit text. The first verse (which is the Antiphon) is repeated after the fourth verse.


