MONDAY 6th January 2025 Monday after Epiphany

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

A holy day has dawned upon us:
Come, you nations, and adore the
Lord, for a great light has come down
upon the earth.

FIRST READING: 1 John 3:22-4:6

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 2:7-8, 10-11

R. I will give you all the nations for
your heritage.

The Lord said to me: 'You are my
Son.
It is I who have begotten you this
day.
Ask and I shall bequeath you the
nations,
put the ends of the earth in your
possession.' **R.**

Now, O kings, understand,
take warning, rulers of the earth;
serve the Lord with awe
and trembling, pay him your
homage. **R.**

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

TUESDAY 7th January 2025 Tuesday after Epiphany

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

Blessed is he who comes in the name
of the Lord: The Lord is God and has
given us light.

FIRST READING: 1 John 4:7-10

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 71:1-4, 7-8

R. Lord, every nation on earth will
adore you.

O God give your judgement to the
king,
to a king's son your justice,
that he may judge your people in
justice
and your poor in right judgement. **R.**

May the mountains bring forth peace
for the people and the hills, justice.
May he defend the poor of the people
and save the children of the
needy. **R.**

In his days justice shall flourish
and peace till the moon fails.
He shall rule from sea to sea,
from the Great River to earth's
bounds. **R.**

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 71:1-2, 10-13

R. Lord, every nation on earth will
adore you.

O God, give your judgement to the
king,
to a king's son your justice,
that he may judge your people in
justice
and your poor in right judgement. **R.**

The kings of Tarshish and the sea
coasts
shall pay him tribute.

The kings of Sheba and Seba
shall bring him gifts.

Before him all kings shall fall
prostrate,
all nations shall serve him. **R.**

For he shall save the poor when they
cry
and the needy who are helpless.
He will have pity on the weak
and save the lives of the poor. **R.**

ENTRANCE ANTHIPHON:

In the beginning and before all ages,
the Word was God
and he humbled himself to be born
the Saviour of the world.

FIRST READING: 1 John 4:19-5:4

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 71:1-2, 14-15, 17 (JB)

R. Lord, every nation on earth will
adore you.

O God, give your judgement to the
king,
to a king's son your justice,
that he may judge your people in
justice
and your poor in right judgement. **R.**

From oppression he will rescue their
lives,

to him their blood is dear.

They shall pray for him without
ceasing

and bless him all the day. **R.**

May his name be blessed for ever
and endure like the sun.

Every tribe shall be blessed in him,
All nations bless his name. **R.**

Friday after Epiphany

ENTRANCE PROCESSION

A light has risen in the darkness for
the upright of heart;
the Lord is generous, merciful and
just.

FIRST READING 1 John 5:5-13

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 147:12-15, 19-20

R. Praise the Lord, Jerusalem.

O praise the Lord, Jerusalem!
Zion, praise your God!
He has strengthened the bars of your
gates,
he has blessed the children within
you. **R.**

He established peace on your
borders,
he feeds you with finest wheat.
He sends out his word to the earth
and swiftly runs his command. **R.**

decrees. **R.**

ENTRANCE PROCESSION

so that we might receive adoption as
children.

FIRST READING 1 John 5:14-21

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 149:1-6

R. The Lord takes delight in his
people.

Sing a new song to the Lord,
his praise in the assembly of the
faithful.
Let Israel rejoice in its Maker,
let Zion's sons exult in their king. **R.**

Let them praise his name with
dancing
and make music with timbrel and
harp.
For the Lord takes delight in his
people.
He crowns the poor with
salvation. **R.**

Let the faithful rejoice in their glory,
shout for joy and take their rest.
Let the praise of God be on their
lips;
this honour is for all his faithful. **R.**
