without a shepherd.*

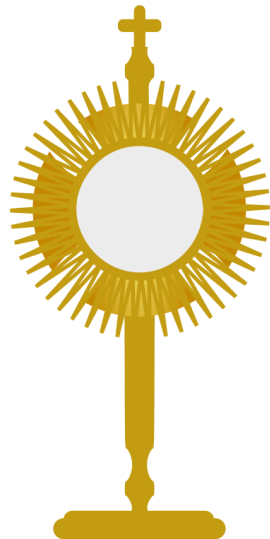
Celebrant: Jesus said, 'The harvest is
