Tuesday of the fifth week of Easter

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

FIRST READING:

Acts 14:19-28 (JB)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 144:10-13, 21 (JB)

R. Your friends tell the glory of your kingship, Lord.
or
R. Alleluia.

All your creatures shall thank you, O Lord,
and your friends shall repeat their blessing.
They shall speak of the glory of your reign
and declare your might, O God,
to make known to men your mighty deeds
and the glorious splendour of your reign. **R.**

Yours is an everlasting kingdom;
your rule lasts from age to age. **R.**

Let me speak the praise of the Lord,
let all mankind bless his holy name
for ever, for ages unending. **R.**

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

If we have died with Christ,
we believe that we shall also live with Christ, alleluia.

WEDNESDAY 18 MAY 2022*Wednesday of the fifth week of Easter***ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:**

Let my mouth be filled with your praise, that I may sing aloud;
my lips shall shout for joy, when I sing to you, alleluia.

FIRST READING:

Acts 15:1-6 (JB)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:*Ps 121:1-5 (JB)*

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.
or
R. Alleluia.

I rejoiced when I heard them say:
'Let us go to God's house.'

And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. **R.**

My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: John 15:9-11 (JB)

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

Christ died for all, that those who live may live no longer for themselves, but for him who died for them and is risen, alleluia.

**FRIDAY 20 MAY 2022***Friday of the fifth week of Easter***ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:**

Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour, alleluia.

FIRST READING:

Acts 15:22-31 (JB)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:*Ps 56:8-12 (JB)*

R. I will praise you among the nations, O Lord.
or
R. Alleluia.

My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready.

I will sing, I will sing your praise.

Awake my soul, awake lyre and harp, I will awake the dawn. **R.**

I will thank you Lord among the peoples, praise you among the nations; for your love reaches to the heavens and your truth to the skies./ O God, arise above the heavens; may your glory shine on earth! **R.**

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia!

I call you my friends, says the Lord, for I have made known to you all that the Father has told me. Alleluia!

GOSPEL:

John 15:12-17 (JB)

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

The Crucified is risen from the dead and has redeemed us, alleluia.

SATURDAY 21 MAY 2022*Saturday of the fifth week of Easter***ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:**

You have been buried with Christ in Baptism, through which you also rose again by faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead, alleluia.

FIRST READING:

Acts 16:1-10 (JB)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:*Ps 99:1-3, 5 (JB)*

R. Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.
or
R. Alleluia.

Cry out with joy to the Lord, all the earth. Serve the Lord with gladness. Come before him, singing for joy. **R.**

Know that he, the Lord, is God. He made us, we belong to him, we are his people, the sheep of his flock. **R.**

Indeed, how good is the Lord, eternal his merciful love. He is faithful from age to age. **R.**

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia!

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: John 15:18-21 (JB)

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

Father, I pray for them, that they may be one in us, so that the world may believe it was you who sent me, says the Lord, alleluia.
