Celebrant: Jesus said, 'The harvest is ready.'

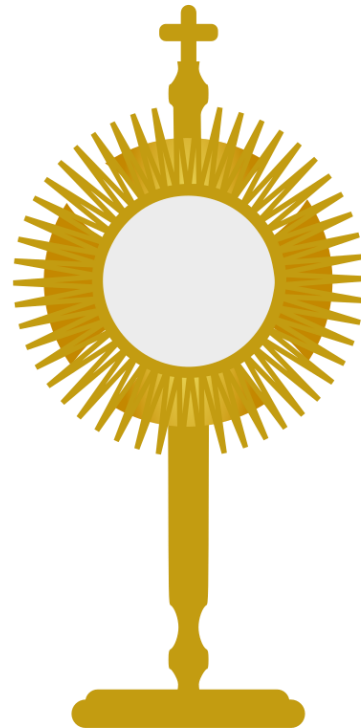
Response: *But the labourers are few.*
