Celebrant: Jesus said, "The harvest is ready."

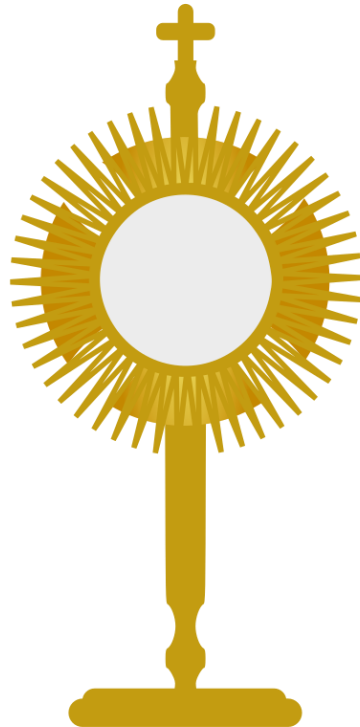
Response: *But the labourers are few.*

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 144:17-21 (JB)

who call on him from their hearts. **R.**

He grants the desires of those who fear him,
he hears their cry and he saves them.
The Lord protects all who love him;
